

## **BUSINESS RESILIENCE TO THRIVE AND SHOP LOCAL**

The Mission Chamber and the District of Mission's "I Love Mission" campaign are once again working together, this time to offer local business owners a unique opportunity to earn a COVID-19 recovery certificate.

The BC Chamber Network has launched a program called *Building Resilience to Thrive*, developed in partnership with the <u>University of Victoria's, Gustavson</u> <u>School of Business</u>. The purpose of the program is to equip individuals to help mitigate the negative impacts of the pandemic, and it focuses on teaching businesses how to adapt their business models, re-engage customers, and adjust workplace cultures

The 6-week program, delivered by award-winning professors Dr. Mark Colgate and Prof. Brian Leacock, will be offered in three cohorts, with weekly seminars supplemented by local Resiliency Roundtables to bring local SMEs together in



smaller groups online and offline to anchor and support the curriculum. The program will focus on three key themes of Strive, Build, and Create.

Seminar topics will be:

- Power of Context Unconscious Bias
- Emotional Intelligence
- The Power of Coaching in Business
- Hire and manage a diverse team
- Improve experiences for colleagues and customers
- Adapt your service strategy for better outcomes

To ensure that cost wasn't a barrier, the program was made available to Chamber members for \$35 and non-members for \$70, however, thanks to the "I Love Mission" Campaign even this barrier may be removed. Businesses can have the nominal registration fee reimbursed by following a few easy steps that begin by contacting the Mission Chamber office to find out the details.

## Voting Opens November 15th for your Favourite Mission Businesses

The initial process for the 20th annual Mission Business Excellence Awards has been underway since September. The first polls are now closed and the nominations in each of the award categories tallied. Now comes the real work, starting November 15th, the polls will once again open to voting, but this time votes will be cast to select the top three finalists in each award category.

## What is the Mission Business Excellence Awards?

This event, hosted by the Mission Regional Chamber of Commerce, is a celebration of business excellence, recognizing local businesses who have made exceptional contributions through their involvement and leadership in the community.

It is a time for the business community to come together and show their appreciation towards businesses and organizations that have helped shape the community and showcase the leaders that actualize superior workplace practices and values.

What are the next steps in the process? Community voting will run from November 15th to December 30th and all Business Excellence Nominees will be listed in the respective categories using a single-choice survey system. Only one vote per IP address will be allowed. After the community vote closes, the top three finalists will be reviewed under a panel of community judges to ensure accuracy of alignment with the award category.

The judge's scores as well as the public vote will come together to determine the winner for the award category. Finalists in each category will be announced in January and the top scores revealed during the Business Excellence Awards Celebration in February 2021

## Spotlight on Business Community Futures North Fraser experiencing extreme growth

It's a time of unparalleled change at Community Futures North Fraser (CFNF) in Mission.

Under the leadership of executive director Gwen Atkinson, CFNF is taking a new approach to providing business support, training and financing for its clients, pivoting to free online programming featuring courses catering to all levels of business proficiency, not just beginners.

"We've strengthened our partnerships in the region, getting to know all the businesses through the Mission Downtown Business Association and Mission Regional Chamber of Commerce," said Atkinson, who after three years elevating CFNF's presence in the community as marketing director, assumed her new role in June.

CFNF sponsored the successful Vision 20/20 series earlier this year with the Mission Chamber, offering a pair of Canadian Top 100 TED Talks speakers not normally within reach (Dr. Karyn

Goddard on emotional intelligence/career success and Eric Termuende on building a thriving culture post-Covid). "We're tapping into new resources and advisors."

The non-profit organization is in a new location at 33163 Second Ave. Jeanette Calderone is the new operations manager and 13-year employee Michelle Blackwell is business analyst.

"I've been in Mission my entire life and bring a fresh new angle to everything. I have seen the ups and downs of businesses here and look forward to seeing more growth and development," said Atkinson.

CFNF, supported through Western Economic Diversification Canada, is also trying to make self employment more attractive to people who are considering working and living in the same place. Facilitator Pamela Chatry offers weekly remote self-employment classes by referral from WorkBC in Mission and Abbotsford.

Atkinson said CFNF serves clients from Mission to Kent to Harrison Hot Springs, makes on average 10 loans annually to businesses for an approximate total of \$900,000 a year from a loan fund of \$3 million.

The organization has seen extreme growth during Covid, issuing more than \$500,000 in Regional Relief Recovery funds and providing forgivable Emergency Relief funding decided by a panel.

CFNF's repertoire of local business success stories is amazing.


